

Madison Square Presbyterian Church, New York, New York

According to Hall's Index of American Presbyterian Congregations, the Madison Square Presbyterian Church, in New York, New York, (this should not be confused with Madison Avenue, a different congregation) was reported in 1853 and merged into First Presbyterian Church in 1919. According to the Work's Progress Administration's Church Archives of N.Y.C., this Church was located at Madison Ave. and 24th Street until 1919. It continued to exist as Madison Square (located on 3rd Ave) while it was affiliated with First Presbyterian Church, and was also called the Madison Square Church House.

The Presbyterian Historical Society holds the following records of the First Presbyterian Church New York, which includes entities that merged into the congregation:

First Presbyterian Church (New York, N.Y.) Records, 1717-1961. Collection consists of minutes, registers, and other records of First Presbyterian Church (1717-1954), Mercer Street Presbyterian Church (1835-1918), University Place Presbyterian Church (1843-1926), Madison Square Presbyterian Church (1853-1925), and Madison Square Church House (1914-1961). 12 cubic feet.
